The introduction of your essay begins with an attention getter before introducing the topic and main ideas of your paper. An attention getter captures the audience's attention and makes the reader want to

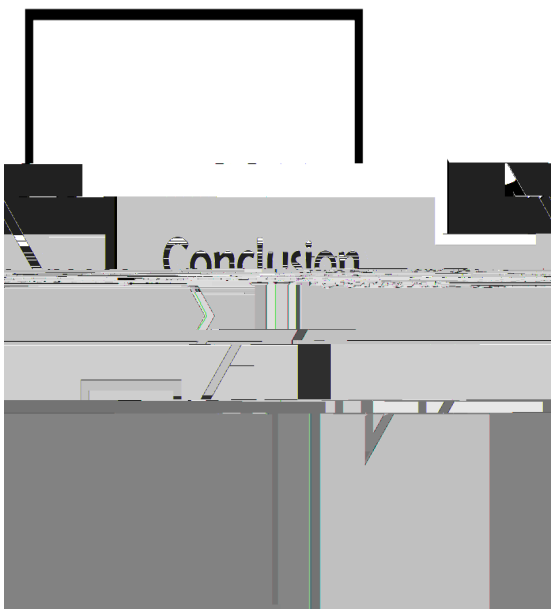
